Neuropsychiatric Services for Men

Cygnet Grange & Cygnet Lodge, Nottinghamshire

Cygnet Grange and Cygnet Lodge are two individual 8 bedded Neuropsychiatric rehabilitation care and treatment facilities for those affected by acquired brain injuries. They both are a safe and secure place to aid recovery as well as offering those diagnosed with a progressive neurological disease, like Huntingdon's Disease, a caring and long term placement to support and help manage the progression of their symptoms.

Both services are registered as hospitals and are designed specifically to provide a clinically-led evidence-based neuropsychiatric pathway for those individuals presenting with behaviours that challenge. Our focus is to create a therapeutic rich environment which engages individuals and offers them the opportunity to minimise their behaviours of distress and maximise their independence.

We provide a resource intensive in-house Neuropsychiatry inter-disciplinary team. Our person-centred approach puts the individual at the centre of their treatment and discharge planning. The services offer a wide range of activities and facilities to promote independent function. Positive behaviour goals are focussed on discharge planning to support the men in our care to return to community living - either with support or independently.

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Our service user profile:

- Men aged 18+ years affected by a neurological condition where challenging behaviour is the leading impairment
- > May be detained under the Mental Health Act, informal or subject to DoLS
- > May have a forensic history
- > With a diagnosis of:
 - Established or suspected Acquired Brain Injury including those sustained through trauma, anoxia, stroke, tumour, virus or infection
 - Established or suspected neurodegenerative condition including Huntington's Disease
 - Specialist Dementia e.g.
 Frontotemporal Dementia
 - Korsakoff's Syndrome or other substance abuse related brain injury

- > Presenting symptoms may include:
 - Dysphasia or other
 communication problems
 - Moderate to severe cognitive impairment
 - Respiratory difficulty requiring support of BiPAP (Bi-level Positive Airway Pressure) or CPAP (Continuous Positive Airway Pressure)
 - Mobility impairments
- > Presenting Comorbidities may include:
 - Psychiatric disorders including psychoses
 - Complex epilepsy
 - Post-ictal psychosis
 - Organic personality disorder







Our services at a glance:

- > Inpatient bespoke assessment and treatment programmes offering both slow stream Neurobehavioural rehabilitation and long term
- symptom management > 3 – 6 month inpatient assessment/review of
- behaviour management > Overview and stabilisation of medication with monitoring of side effects

- > Risk assessment and management
- > Treatment for co-morbid psychiatric conditions
- > Cognitive and executive function rehabilitation
- > Community reintegration assessment
- > Daily living skills rehabilitation
- > Assessment, treatment and management of associated physical deficits and physical health conditions
