Discharge is discussed from the very beginning; service users are asked what they want to achieve from being at Meridian Unit and everyone works together to develop a plan that can help achieve

Our pathway is enhanced by access to our nearby community-focused mental health rehabilitation facility, Cygnet Lodge Lewisham, which enables us to provide an integrated care pathway to reduce lengths of stay and enhance the outcome for service users.

Service users can be supported in attending educational courses, and work in local voluntary employment. In this respect the location of the hospital is ideal, being in urban London's Zone 2, near Greenwich and Deptford. It is also close to local parks and colleges.

The Psychological therapies team at Cygnet Hospital Blackheath provide a comprehensive range of assessments and interventions that simultaneously address mental health issues and facilitate management of risk. Our pathway has three components:

- 1 Assessment and Stabilisation
- 2 Exploration and Change
- 3 Recovery and Maintenance

Our service user profile

- > Men, aged 18+ years
- Primary diagnosis of mental illness
- Detained under the Mental Health Act, including Ministry of Justice restrictions
- Requiring assessment and treatment in a secure environment
- May have a history of trauma

Interventions focused on the individual's mental health and on risk / offence are offered, including:

- > Cognitive Behavioural Therapy (CBT)
- Dialectical Behaviour Therapy (DBT) Based Coping Skills
- Offence Chain Analysis
- Good Lives Model
- Substance Use Treatment Programme (SUTP)
- > Life Minus Violence Enhanced (LMV-E)
- Life Minus Violence Harmful Sexual Behaviour (LMV-HSB)




Global Assessment of Progress (GAP)

The Global Assessment of Progress (GAP) is our specialist outcome tool used within Meridian Unit at Cygnet Hospital Blackheath. The tool allows us to measure an individual's progress throughout their placement, plot the positive developments, setbacks and changes in wellbeing but also identify the warning signs of any possible deterioration, whilst informing care planning and being transparent about future risks.



Individuals in our care had an average GAP score increase of 31% on discharge





Our referral process:

- Referral made to Cygnet referrals team via 0808 164 4450/chcl.referrals@nhs.net
- Assessment arranged and undertaken via our management team
- Feedback provided on whether our service can meet the individual's needs
- Assessment pack formulated including care plans and funding information
- Admission agreed and plans for transition arranged with referring team following confirmation of acceptance of placement
