Magical Visitors

On February 11th Phoenix School was visited by Zora and Mads from Grimm & Co, a local storytelling charity who host magical and mythical workshops at their own site and in schools for children of all ages.

Over the past few months, Eric and Katy have been planning sessions with Grimm & Co, including visiting Grimm's site in Rotherham on two occasions to deliver training to Grimm staff about our setting.

Zora and Mads delivered two sessions, one for Pegasus and one for Unicorn and Griffin wards. These sessions were group story writing sessions. The sessions started with an opportunity to investigate some of the magical items from Grimm's apothecary, including grandma's scabs, peace and quiet, and troll earwax.

Following this, students and staff were encouraged to spin a wheel to discover which magical creature they are before engaging in some silly ways of re-starting the adults' imagination.

The students in both sessions engaged well as teams to create characters, settings, and plots for their stories, including a spoon-human who was in a race to complete a maze, and a dragon who worked on Cygnet Sheffield's mythical 5th ward, accessible only through the lift that never works.

Grimm & Co will now print and bind our students' stories as well as having their own illustrators illustrate them. Copies of our stories are available in the school library for all to read, and Grimm even supplied colouring sheets of all of the illustrations used in the book.

We look forward to Grimm's next visit on the 14th March.





Food for Thought

The Quarterly Food Forum was held with both the CAMHS wards and the Spencer Ladies.

On Spencer, the forum started with an incredibly informative and presentation by HM (Service User on Spencer Ward) getting us to

think about what influences how our diets develop.

There was also really great attendance from all wards across CAMHS- service users and staff. Lots of feedback to think about!

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Following on from this the following changes will be made/have already been implemented across the hospital:

- We agreed to change the colour of the plates, side plates and bowls to white which is both dietician approved and particularly good for those with sensory needs so that they can see the food and separate it into parts if this is required.
- We agreed for Ollie to take a photo of each meal put together on a plate as an example for the service users so they can see what they should be getting and also the staff (support workers and kitchen staff) to show them what it should look like at point of being served. Each meal the photographed over the next 8 weeks to start building portfolio.
- Extra portions of vegetables/salad to be readily available to allow service users to fill up on these rather than less healthy options.
- We will be creating and implementing a Cygnet Sheffield Menu Booklet, which will contain the calories, carbs, protein, fat fibre content- also the allergens and list of ingredients. This will be created in collaboration with the Dietician, Sam and Chef, Ollie. We will be providing a copy for Main Staff Room to allow staff to access this information when making choices from the menu.

We look forward to seeing how these changes have improved eating experiences for staff and service users in our next Food Forum.
