Dunblane Care Manager Scoops National Award

A Dunblane care manager who supports adults with learning disabilities has scooped a national award in recognition of her ongoing dedication.

Jorden Gallagher is the manager of Cygnet Social Care's Ranaich House, a specialist residential service on Leewood Road, Dunblane which supports adults with learning disabilities and complex needs, including those with mental health or physical health needs. She won a Special Recognition award for her dedicated service at Cygnet Group's annual nursing awards.

The Cygnet Nursing Conference and Awards took place last week at the National Motorcycle Museum in Birmingham.

On receiving her award, Jorden said: "I'm really passionate about my role as a social care nurse and advocating for the difference we make. Social care nurses can often be viewed as 'the poor relative' and I really feel that we are showing the positive impact we have by helping people thrive in meeting their own outcomes.

"I have spent most of my time since qualifying in different social care environments and developed as a leader, I'm really proud to work for Cygnet Social Care.

"I truly believe as a nurse that here is the place we can make the biggest difference in people's lives. The residents we have here are truly happy and that means so much to me, what we do every day is for the people we support and that's all we can ask for!"
