Security duties were also shared with the service's beloved pet therapy dog Harri, who wore his own high-vis vest and staff lanyard, specially made by Lisa.

Other highlights included a vibrant face painting and hair styling tent, where staff created dazzling neon looks, face gems, and colourful hair extensions. Festival games such as neon hook-a-duck and a coconut shy offered the chance to win sensory toys and personalised keyrings.

The event closed on a sweet note with a visit from Jane & Phil's Ice Cream Truck, serving cool treats to staff and service users alike under a rare appearance from the sunshine.

Joe praised the incredible team effort from everyone at the Cygnet Health Care service.

He said: "This event was all about bringing people together, celebrating creativity, and having fun. Everyone got involved, from maintenance and care staff to the kitchen team and, most importantly, the service users themselves.
